



Return to School in September 2020



Does my child have to attend school in September?

Yes, from Thursday 3rd September all children **must** return to school, unless children are in Reception or Nursery and partaking in a staggered start.

How will you keep my child safe?

We will be putting in measures to keep our community as safe as possible. We cannot guarantee that your child will not become unwell at any time.

What will my child wear?

Clean, full school uniform must be worn each day. A coat must be brought each day. Bags or other items **must not** be brought between school and home.

You will need:

A full, named water bottle.

If you do not pre-order a school meal (sandwich option only) you will need to bring a packed lunch.

Other information:

The car park remains closed to parents/carers

Start and end times will be staggered. Please arrive promptly for your slot

Only one adult will be allowed to drop-off or pick up your child

Each class will form its own bubble. As far as possible, these bubbles will not mix.



School response if a child displays Covid-19 symptoms during school time

Concern raised by the child themselves or by an adult supervising.

Person is isolated immediately. Child's parents will be contacted.

Child must be collected immediately from school.

Mandatory 10 days of self-isolation

Negative Test Result:

The child must complete the compulsory 10 days self-isolation.

Parents MUST inform school of the test outcome immediately.

Test MUST be arranged and MUST take place. Families must engage with the Test and Trace process.

Positive Test Result: The child must complete the compulsory 10 days self-isolation from the date of the test. What if my child displays symptoms at home?

Isolate your child, where possible

Do not allow your child to attend school or visit other public places

Mandatory 10 days of self-isolation

Inform school if your child is displaying symptoms

Negative Test Result:

The child must complete the compulsory 10 days self-isolation.

Parents **MUST** inform school of the test outcome **immediately.**

Test **MUST** be arranged and **MUST** take place. Families must engage with the Test and Trace process.

What if I am contacted by NHS Test and Trace?

Follow all instructions
from the NHS Test and
Trace advisor

Inform school immediately

If you are contacted on a weekend, inform school by 9am on
the Monday morning.



Other FAQs

Will my child need their PE kit in school?

No, initially we plan for children to come to school in their PE kits on the day they have PE. Your child's PE day will be shared with you in September.

Will my child need their book bag?

No. Other than a lunch box, coat and water bottle, no other items should be brought into school. We will be sending home plastic wallets with reading books in them.

Will my child be in a class with their peers?

Yes. We will be teaching children in their year group classes. Each Year 2–6 class will be known as a 'bubble', with Reception & Year 1 in their own bubbles.

Will children social distance in school?

Children within the same bubble will be in class groups. Government guidance states that children within a bubble may not be able to distance socially. Adults will distance from children as much as possible.

Will breakfast club and BAFTA club be available?

Yes. Breakfast and BAFTA club will be running, but under a revised format.
