### Maths

Set up a teddy bears' picnic and share out different types of food with the teddies. You have to make sure that each teddy gets an **equal** amount so it is fair!

For example, you could share out 8 grapes between 4 teddies—how many grapes does each teddy get? Can all numbers of items be shared equally with your teddies?



### English

Complete research on your favourite animal, this could be anything from a goldfish to an African elephant. You could use the internet or using any books you have at home. When you have collected a range of facts great a fact file book telling me everything you know about your chosen animal. What do they look like? What do they eat? How do they move?



### Science

Gather together your small world animals from farm animals to zoo animals.

Look at their different features and use what you know about them to put them into different groups. Talk to your grown up about why you've grouped them like that, what do they all have in common? Can you group them another way? If you don't have animals, use pictures or names written on slips of paper.
