What's happening in school

Throughout the week, each class will be taking part in a small kindness project. They will spend one afternoon planning and carrying out a simple act of kindness within our school community. Examples include writing thank-you cards, creating positive posters or helping another class in some way.

These activities are designed to help pupils think about how they can use their "power for good" to support others and make our school a welcoming, kind place for everyone.
