Safeguarding Snippet

Welcome back after what I hope was a fun and safe summer. Each week we have a section on our newsletter, known as the 'Safeguarding Snippet' through which we aim to share information that will help to inform and keep the members of our community safe from harm. This week's snippet is all about enabling restricted mode on YouTube on a variety of devices.

As many of you will be aware, the autoplay feature on YouTube makes it easier to decide what to watch next. When Autoplay is on, another related video will automatically play after a video ends. This sometimes leads to children seeing content with mature themes, includes inappropriate language or harmful ideas. By changing your YouTube settings to restricted, you will help create natural breaks for your child, protecting them from unsuitable content and encouraging healthier online habits. The programme encourages the children to understand their differences and to feel confident in their identities, preparing them for life as global citizens. 
BAFTA

Mrs Elston

Who is Mrs Elston and what is her role in school?
I have worked at Monkhouse school for eighteen years and during this time my role has changed. Having previously supported class teachers and SEND children, I am now the schools Emotional Literacy Support Assistant (ELSA) and Senior Mental Health Lead.

What do I do?

I support children that may be going through difficult times at home, in school or struggling with their emotions.

These could be due to anxiety, anger, behaviour, bereavement, low self-esteem and any other emotion based difficulty.

I support children 1-1 or within groups. Sessions are tailor made and specifically suited to their needs. The interventions can last between 6-12 weeks and parents are contacted if I feel they need my support. Resources and strategies will be provided to help them through their difficult times.

Alongside my ELSA role I am also trained to deliver drawing & talking intervention, feelings detective and many other emotion based interventions.

YOUTUBE: TURN OFF AUTOPLAY

+ ENABLE RESTRICTED MODE

Step by step guide for different devices



Autoplay: When a video finishes, YouTube automatically plays another one. This feature can encourage children to watch for hours and may expose them to inappropriate content.

Restricted Mode: This is a filter designed to hide numerous videos that are flagged as mature or inappropriate, creating a safer browsing experience.



Autoplay on mobile (iOS/Android):

- OPEN YOUTUBE ➡ TAP YOUR PROFILE PHOTO
- SETTINGS ➡ AUTOPLAY ➡ TOGGLE OFF
- Or in any video's watch screen: tap the AUTOPLAY switch to off



Autoplay on desk top:

- OPEN YOUTUBE.COM ➡ WATCH ANY VIDEO
- AT THE BOTTOM OF THE PLAYER, CLICK THE AUTOPLAY SWITCH TO OFF

Restricted Mode:



- MOBILE: CLICK THE PROFILE PHOTO ➡ RESTRICTED MODE ON
- COMPUTER: CLICK PROFILE PHOTO ➡ SETTINGS ➡ GENERAL ➡ RESTRICTED MODE ➡ TURN ON
