
## KAPLA Workshops





## Year 6 Magistrates in the Community



Year 6 were privileged to participate in an enriching session delivered by a serving magistrate, who explained how laws are made and how courts and magistrates operate. They learnt about the penalties for offences such as using a mobile phone while driving and shoplifting, gaining a valuable understanding of how everyday actions can carry serious legal consequences. The pupils then took part in a mock youth-court



hearing, taking on roles including the victim, the accused, the magistrates,

the legal adviser, and the prosecution and defence solicitors. The experience was highly informative - particularly in revealing that, in the UK, the age of criminal responsibility is as young as ten.

## Yr 2 - Mr Addison



On Monday, Skylarks class put into practice the learning they have been doing in music lessons about 'call and response'. They had already learned previously

that a call and response song has a phrase that is performed first by one group and is then answered with a different phrase by another group. The children had to think of a suitable answer to a question about different safari animals to build their call and response song. They then had to use a percussion instrument of their choice to beat along with the rhythm of the words in their call and response performance. It was great to see the children working in teams of four to construct their performance. All the groups performed their call and responses confidently in front of the class - I was so impressed!. ## Yr 6 - Mr McHugh

This week, Ospreys became designers! We started by carefully taking apart fabric tote bags to see exactly how they were made. The children were fascinated to discover how just a few simple pieces of fabric could be joined together to create a strong, useful product. They then drew and measured their own pattern pieces for the bags, just like real designers would.

With this experience, they moved on to creating pattern pieces for waist-coats of their own design. They thought carefully about size, shape and how the different pieces would fit together. There was lots of excitement as they imagined how their finished waistcoats might look.
