YEAR 2 - KINGFISHERS

This week, Kingfishers were very busy creating! We explored how natural materials can be used to make our own sculptures, which we will photograph and sketch in our next lesson.

We looked at the work of David M. Bird for inspiration and then went to a nature area to collect natural resources such as sticks, leaves, and stones. Back in the classroom, we used hot glue guns to assemble our sculptures, with some helpful support from Mrs Smolen.

Thankfully, no fingers were burned, and everyone worked carefully and creatively. The children showed great teamwork and imagination, and we are looking forward to continuing this project next lesson.

YEAR 4 - CURLEWS

Curlews class have finished their work on still life drawings this week and WOW I have been blown away by their skills. Over the last two half terms, we have learnt lots of different sketching skills such as hatching, cross-hatching and stippling. The children then have learnt about using tone and shadows to create more in-depth drawings. These are some of their final pieces including the feedback from other children on their great work. Falcons have been busy developing their ink wash skills, using them to apply tone to their atmospheric WWII-style pieces. They used their photography skills to capture highly effective poses, carefully considering perspective and using these images as inspiration for their final pieces.
