RECEPTION - WRENS

This term Reception have been exploring different jobs, particularly jobs within the local community and different people who help us. So far we have been lucky enough to have visits from the fire brigade, and the paramedic. This week the PCSO came to visit us! The children had lots of fantastic questions to ask such as; What do you need to wear? How fast can a police car go? Wrens have thoroughly enjoyed these first hand experiences, and we can't wait for our final visitor next week..!



YEAR 1 - ROBINS

In Maths this week, we have been exploring numbers up to 50. The children have enjoyed learning about the numbers 10, 20, 30, 40 and 50 and practising counting in tens. We also focused on place value, helping the children understand that numbers are made up of tens and ones. For example, we learned that 20 is made up of 2 tens, which is the same as 20 ones. The children showed great enthusiasm and growing confidence when working with these numbers.



YEAR 3 - PUFFINS

This term in Art, Puffins have been developing their drawing and printing skills. We explored the work of the Japanese artist Katsushika Hokusai, focusing on how he used line and texture in his artwork. Inspired by this, the children practiced a range of pencil techniques, including cross-hatching, scumbling, stippling and blending. Puffins have shown great focus and creativity while developing these skills and have taken pride in their work. Next term, they are looking forward to using their drawings as the starting point for printing.



YEAR 5 - HAWKS

In art, Year 5 have been exploring how tone and painting techniques can be used to create mood and atmosphere. The children studied landscape artwork, looking closely at how colour choices, brush strokes and light can change how a scene feels. Using this learning, pupils created their own landscape paintings inspired by the work of L.S. Lowry and Edward Hopper. They experimented with tone and texture before developing their final pieces, producing thoughtful and expressive artwork.
