ROAD SAFETY NEWS

Cllr Ingrid and Cllr M Hasan will be installing new Road Safety Partnership 30mph signs over the coming days to help address ongoing speeding concerns on our road. Our councillors have also worked together to purchase four digital speed-indication units. These devices can collect data and will be placed in areas where driver behaviour is currently unsafe. Funding has come from their DCB budgets along with contributions from several other councillors.

In addition, LCC Highways are in the process of securing a Traffic Regulation Order (TRO) to support longer-term safety measures.

We hope these steps will help make the area safer for all our children and families.



SAFEGUARDING SNIPPET

WhatsApp Group Settings

WhatsApp is a social messaging app that is used by over 2.7 billion people every month. It lets users message others via their mobile network, Wi-Fi network or, via WhatsApp Web, their broadband network. Users can send text, voice and video messages, make voice and video calls and share information and documents. To use the service in the UK, users must be 13-years-old or older (as of April 2024. The minimum age for WhatsApp used to be 16). Only people who have a WhatsApp account can send and receive messages through the app or WhatsApp Web. Anyone can add your child to a group unless you change their group privacy settings within the app. Just like one-to-one chats, users can send text, video, images and more.

Add Everyone groups

These are WhatsApp groups often set up by groomers or strangers otherwise seeking to exploit children. They add large amounts of users and might also ask children to add their contact list.

This gives potentially harmful strangers easy access to a large number of impressionable children. They might then manipulate, coerce or share sexual content with them. Like with phishing scams, casting a wide net could mean more children are likely to respond.

Attached is a factsheet with more information around WhatsApp and also an instruction guide on how to change WhatsApp group settings to avoid strangers being able to add your child into larger unmonitored groups within the app.



YEAR 1 - ROBINS

We have had a very busy and exciting week in Robins. The children have really enjoyed our outdoor learning sessions, where they worked together in teams to create their own obstacle courses. It was wonderful to see their teamwork, creativity, and problem-solving skills as they designed and tested their courses. In Maths, we have been exploring capacity. The children have been measuring and comparing different amounts using a variety of containers, helping them to understand how we measure liquids and how capacity can change depending on the size of the container.



YEAR 3 - PUFFINS

Puffins have been busy learning about fractions in Maths. We have focused on comparing fractions by carefully looking at the numerators and denominators. The children have enjoyed explaining their reasoning and showing it through drawing bar models.

In English, Puffins have been writing narratives to build suspense. The children have been experimenting with a variety of techniques, such as rhetorical questions and show not tell descriptions to make their stories engaging.
