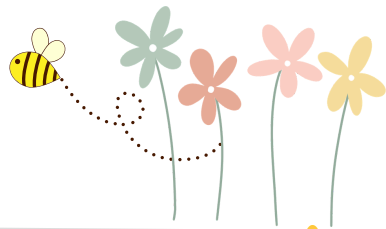

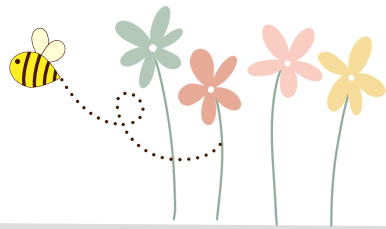

With a new season on the horizon – and POSH trials just a few weeks away – we're excited to see what comes next. If this year is anything to go by, she's only going to keep rising.

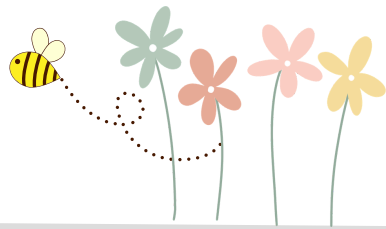
