


<p>English This term, children will be exploring balanced arguments through discussions and debates based on well-known fairy tales. They will consider the choices made by different characters and learn how to present both sides of an argument before reaching a conclusion. Later in the term, children will learn about formal and informal letters, comparing their features and purpose before writing their own letters for different audiences and situations.</p>	<p>Science Our key question is: How do we change as we grow older? During this unit of work, children will learn about the different stages of the human life cycle. They will discuss a simple timeline first before going into more depth about what happens in the womb, during puberty and when you are older.</p>	<p>Maths We will be learning about negative number, converting units and volume. Within the unit, children will learn how to find differences and look at sequence problems. As well looking at measurement in depth to gain a secure understanding when converting units of a variety of measures. Children will end the year using their multiplication skills to good effect when learning about volume.</p>
<p>PE Year 5 will be learning how to play cricket. The children will focus on throwing and catching, as well as understanding how to field the ball correctly. They will also learn how to bat and bowl. In addition, children will take part in outdoor learning activities, developing their teamwork, communication, problem-solving and resilience skills through a range of practical challenges and investigations.</p>		<p>DT In DT this term the children will complete a unit entitled 'cooking and nutrition'. They will identify where different foods come from, gaining an understanding of how ingredients are reared and processed, as well as learning and adapting a recipe for spaghetti bolognese to improve its nutritional content. The children will design their own bolognese sauce and create a label with its nutritional content before creating their own dish from scratch.</p>
<p>PSHE This term's PSHE unit is all about 'Growing and Changing'. In this unit children will discuss how to improve their self-esteem and understand the changes that will occur as they grow up. These lessons will be looking at the physical and mental changes the humans go through as they develop into teenagers. The lessons will give children a chance to discuss any worries or concerns they have in a safe environment.</p>	<p>Term 6</p> <p>Were the Vikings raiders, traders or something else?</p>	<p>RE This term, children will be learning about Buddhist worship and devotion. They will explore how Buddhists express their faith both at home and in temples, learning about key concepts such as Puja, the Sangha and meditation. Children will investigate the importance of symbols, sounds and sensory experiences in worship, including prayer flags, incense, bells and the lotus flower. They will also compare Buddhist practices with those of other religions studied this year, reflecting on the different ways people express their beliefs and values.</p>
<p>History This term, children will continue their learning about the Vikings. They will explore where the Vikings came from, why they travelled to Britain and the impact they had on the people who lived here. Children will investigate Viking trade routes, examine historical sources to make inferences and learn about Viking sagas. They will also consider the significance of Viking achievements and how they continue to influence life today.</p>	<p>Computing In computing, children will develop their knowledge of selection by revisiting how conditions can be used in programmes and then learning how the if... then... else structure can be used to select different outcomes depending on whether a condition is true or false, writing programmes to design a quiz.</p>	<p>French In French this term the children will be completing the 'les habitats' unit where they will learn to name all of the five essential elements that animals and plants need to survive in their habitats. They will learn to name five types of habitats and state which animals and which plants live and grow in each habitat in French.</p>
