

Maths

This term, Year 6 will consolidate their learning from the year as they prepare for the KS3 transition. The children will learn how to use the range of operations on a calculator as well be introduced to new functions to experiment with across various challenges.

History

Y6 will explore the question *Who should go on the £10 banknote?* They will investigate a range of historically significant people, using sources to research their achievements and contributions to society. Pupils will learn how to make inferences from evidence, evaluate the impact and legacy of historical figures, and decide what makes someone historically significant.

Art

This term, the children will be continuing their sculpture learning and beginning to form their final pieces. After doing this, they will decoupage their clay models before evaluating how the artists Shonibare and Delany influenced them.

French

In this unit pupils will learn about other countries around the globe that speak the foreign language they are studying. They will also learn about the currencies, flags, cultural traditions and celebrations of those countries. This is a great unit, bringing together all the language covered in the various teaching types.

English

Year 6 will be developing their speaking, listening and performance skills as they prepare for their end-of-year production, *Gigglebox*. Through rehearsals, pupils will refine their understanding of playscript conventions, explore characterisation and stage directions, and learn how to use expression, movement and voice effectively to engage an audience. In writing, they will be developing pieces they have written earlier in the year, using their updated knowledge of spelling, punctuation and grammar.

Year 6 Topic Overview Term 6

RE

This term, Year 6 will explore some of life's biggest questions through thoughtful discussion and reflection. They will consider different ideas about the meaning and purpose of life, drawing on a range of religious and non-religious perspectives. Pupils will examine how people make moral choices, thinking about what influences right and wrong and how these decisions affect individuals and communities. The children will be encouraged to reflect on their own beliefs and values, developing confidence to respectfully express and justify their own worldviews.

Computing

Year 6 will be introduced to the creation of websites for a chosen purpose. They will identify what makes a good web page, use this information to design and evaluate their own website using Google Sites.

DT

Y6 will design and create a steady hand game, use nets to create the bases and apply knowledge of electrical circuits to build an operational circuit with a buzzer that completes the circuit when the handle makes contact with the wire.

PSHE

This term, Year 6 pupils will learn how to stay safe, manage change, and build confidence as they prepare for secondary school. They will explore online safety, including AI and deepfakes, alongside topics such as body image, relationships, and self-esteem, helping them make informed and responsible choices. Pupils will develop strategies for coping with new situations and understanding their emotions, learn about respectful relationships, personal boundaries, and how to seek help if they feel unsure or unsafe.

Music

Y6 will be learning all of the songs for their end-of-year play *Gigglebox*. They will play and perform in solo and ensemble contexts, using their voices and playing musical instruments with increasing accuracy, fluency, control and expression.
